TRUSTWORTHINESS

Integrity — DO: Stand up for your beliefs • Follow your <u>conscience</u> • Be <u>honorable</u> and <u>upright</u>

• Live by your <u>principles</u> no matter what others say • Have the <u>courage</u> to do what is right and to try new things even when it is hard, costly • Build and guard your <u>reputation</u>

DON'T: Do anything wrong • Lose heart if you fail or don't get what you want

Honesty _____ **DO:** Tell the <u>truth</u> and nothing but the truth • Be sincere • Be <u>forthright</u> and <u>candid</u>

DON'T: Lie • Cheat • Steal • Be sneaky, tricky, or <u>deceptive</u>

Reliability — DO: Keep your promises • Honor your word and commitments • Be dependable • Do

what you are supposed to do \bullet Return what you borrow \bullet Pay your debts \bullet Be on time

Loyalty _____ **DO:** Stand by and protect your family, friends, school and country • Be a good friend

• Look out for those who care about you • Keep secrets of those who trust you

DON'T: <u>Betray</u> a <u>trust</u> • Let your friends hurt themselves • Do anything just so others will like you • Ask a friend to do anything wrong or spread <u>gossip</u> that could hurt others

RESPECT

Golden Rule — DO: Treat others the way you want to be treated • Respect the dignity, privacy and

<u>freedom</u> of all individuals • Value and honor all people, no matter what they can do for you or to you • Respect others' property — take good care of property you are allowed to use and don't take or use property without permission • Respect the <u>autonomy</u> of others — tell them what they should know to make good choices about their own lives

DON'T: Use or <u>manipulate</u> others • <u>Abuse</u>, <u>demean</u> or mistreat anyone

Tolerance _____ **DO:** Judge others on their character, abilities, and conduct without regard to race, reliand **Acceptance** gion, gender, where they live, how they dress or the amount of money they have ● Be

tolerant, respectful and accepting of those who are different from you • Listen to others

and try to understand their points of view

Nonviolence — DO: Resolve disagreements, respond to insults and deal with anger peacefully and with-

out violence

DON'T: Use threats or physical force to get what you want or to express anger

Courtesy — DO: Use good manners • Be courteous, polite and <u>civil</u> to everyone

DON'T: Use put-downs, insults or <u>ridicule</u> to embarrass or hurt others

RESPONSIBILITY

— **DO:** Know and do your <u>duty</u> • Acknowledge and meet your legal and moral <u>obligations</u> Duty —

Accountability — DO: Accept responsibility for the <u>consequences</u> of your choices, not only for what you do but what you don't do • Think about consequences on yourself and others before you act ● Think long-term ● Do what you can do to make things better ● Set a good example **DON'T:** Look the other way when you can make a difference • Make excuses or blame others

Pursue -Excellence **DO:** Your best • <u>Persevere</u> • Don't quit • Be <u>prepared</u> • Be <u>diligent</u> • Work hard • Make all you do worthy of pride

Self-Control-

DO: Take charge of your own life • Set realistic goals • Keep a positive outlook • Be <u>prudent</u> and <u>self-disciplined</u> with your health, <u>emotions</u>, time and money • Be <u>rational</u> — act out of reason not anger, revenge or fear • Know the difference between what you have a right to do and what is right to do • Be self-reliant — manage your life so you are not dependent on others; pay your own way whenever you can

FAIRNESS

Justice -

DO: Be fair and just • Treat people equally • Make decisions without <u>favoritism</u> or prejudice • In imposing punishment be sure the consequences for wrongdoing are consistent, certain and proportional (not too harsh or lenient)

DON'T: Take more than your fair share • Take advantage of or blame others unfairly

Openness

DO: Be open-minded and impartial — consider what people have to say before you decide • Be careful — get the facts, including opposing viewpoints, before making decisions (especially blaming or accusing another)

CARING

Concern for Others **DO:** Be <u>compassionate</u> and <u>empathetic</u> • Be kind, loving, and <u>considerate</u> • Be thankful and express gratitude for what people do for you • Forgive others for their shortcomings **DON'T:** Be mean, cruel or <u>insensitive</u>

Charity

DO: Be <u>charitable</u> and <u>altruistic</u> — give money, time, support, comfort without strings for the sake of making someone else's life better, not for praise or gratitude • Help people in need

CITIZENSHIP

Do Your Share — **DO:** Be a good citizen and a good neighbor • Care about and pursue the <u>common good</u>

- Be a volunteer help your school and community be better, cleaner and safer
- Protect the environment by conserving resources, reducing pollution, and cleaning up after yourself • Participate in making things better by voicing your opinion, voting, serving on committees, reporting wrongdoing and paying taxes

and the Law

Respect Authority DO: Play by the rules • Obey parents, teachers, coaches and others who have been given authority • Observe just laws • Honor and respect principles of democracy
